(1) Jacob Younkin - he's on the Upper Turkeyfoot map and in the Somerset Co. Warrant Register. His survey is recorded in Survey Book D2, pg. 18, posted at <http://www.phmc.state.pa.us/bah/dam/rg/di/r17-114CopiedSurveyBooks/r17-114MainInterfacePage.htm>
(2) Richard Wistar - He's in the Bedford Co. Warrant Register, shown as receiving a warrant to survey a tract which contained 52 1/4 acres in Turkeyfoot Twp. on 26 Mar

1788. His survey is recorded in Survey Book A, pg. 417, but Michael A. SANNER patented the tract in 1847.
(3) Laughlin McNEAL patented his tract 16 Jun 1836 (Patent Book H36, pg. 216; Survey Book C142, pg. 202)
(4) I can't make out Chas. _____
(5) I can't make out the one that says "No 4"
(6) Peter LIVENGOOD got a warrant to survey this tract on 29 May 1793 (Bedford Co. Warrant Register; Survey Book C120-123)
